



ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

THE 14 HOUR ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID COURSE

This course teaches members of the public how to provide initial support to an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander experiencing a mental health crisis or developing a mental health problem.

What is Mental Health First Aid?

Mental health first aid is the help given to someone developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis. The first aid is given until appropriate professional treatment is received or until the crisis resolves.

What is the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander MHFA Course?

The second edition Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) course is based on the international MHFA Guidelines. These guidelines were developed using the consensus of mental health consumers, carers and professionals from English-speaking developed countries. Course Content

The course teaches members of the public how to assist an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander who is developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis.

Developing mental health problems covered:

- Depression
- Anxiety
- Psychosis
- Substance misuse

Mental health crises covered:

- Suicidal thoughts and behaviours
- Non-suicidal self-injury
- Panic attacks
- Traumatic events
- Severe psychotic states
- Severe effects from alcohol or other drug misuse
- Aggressive behaviours

Participants will learn about social and emotional wellbeing, mental health first aid interventions in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities, the signs and symptoms of mental health problems, where and how to get help and what sort of help has been shown by research to be effective.

Course Format

This is a 14-hour course (6 modules). The delivery format is flexible. Course participants receive a copy of the MHFA Manual to keep and a Certificate of Completion.

Where can the courses be held?

MHFA courses can be conducted wherever a Mental Health First Aid Instructor can travel. If extended travel is required, the instructor's cost may need to be met (to be negotiated with the instructor).
